Arbitration Experience

I am a fellow of the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators. I have appeared as leading and junior counsel in numerous arbitrations for over 30 years.

More recently, and particularly after taking silk I have been appointed sole arbitrator in England on maritime and commercial disputes and then in the Cayman islands on insurance/construction dispute, investment dispute and joint venture/loan agreement and a commercial lease.

I have had approximately 12 appointments and written about 6 awards and made a number of procedural orders. I have been appointed by bodies specified in the arbitration agreement in one case the President of the Law Society in the Cayman Islands and in another by the Senior Partner of a major accountancy firm in the Cayman Islands.

I have also acted as a part time Judge in both England and the Cayman Islands where I have heard civil trials and written judgments and made procedural orders. I was also a member of the Cayman Islands Law Society sub-committee on arbitration which was instrumental in bringing forward a new Arbitration Law in the Cayman Islands.
