The (Ab)use of Due Process in International Arbitration Lucy Reed, President of the SIAC Court of Arbitration



Due process is widely recognized as fundamental to the arbitral process. In this variation on her 2016 Freshfields Lecture, Ms Reed will explore the origins and evolution of due process rights in international arbitration and the unfortunate recent practice of counsel to elevate routine procedural objections to allegations of due process violations. Her proposition is that this (ab)use of due process as a sword instead of a shield has serious implications for international arbitration and its users.
